Biography

Chris Clark studied Physiology and Medicine in Bristol from 1980 to 1986. He moved to Devon in 1987, worked in Torbay and the Royal Devon & Exeter hospitals until 1991 in general medicine, and then undertook vocational training in general practice.

He joined the Mid Devon Medical Practice in 1994 and was a partner until 2018. He continues to see patients in the practice as a salaried GP. He is Treasurer of the Tamar Faculty of the Royal College of General Practitioners, and represents England on the College's Rural Forum Steering Group.

He has been attached to the Primary Care Research Group at the University of Exeter College of Medicine and Health since 2004. His main research interests are in hypertension and cardiovascular disease, and he is an active Fellow of the British and Irish Hypertension Society sitting on the Executive (2016 – 2019) and various working parties. He is currently leading an international collaboration studying inter-arm blood pressure difference (INTERPRESS). He was awarded a National Institute of Health Research Clinical Lectureship in 2014 and is now a Clinical Senior Lecturer.
