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Many People think that their GP Health Record is available to all NHS Health care professionals involved in their care but this is not always the case.
At the moment, each professional (ie consultants, emergency departments, physiotherapists) you see keeps a separate record.

Summary Care record explained.

NHS England is using an electronic record called the Summary Care Record to support patient care.

Allowing authorised health care staff to have access to this record will improve decision making by doctors and other health care professionals and has prevented mistakes being made when patients are being cared for in an emergency or when their GP practice is closed.

Your Summary Care Record contains important information about any medication you are taking, any allergies you suffer from and any bad reactions to medicines that you have previously experienced. Your Summary Care Record also includes your name, address, date of birth and your unique NHS number to help identify you correctly.

Local Shared Record explained.

Only Health Care Professionals you give permission to and who are directly involved in your care will be able to view the shared record. This may include staff from:
Emergency Departments & minor injury units, GP's including out of hours GP's, Community Nurses, Physiotherapists and Occupational therapists, County wide services such as ambulance services and local Hospitals.

Information shared includes your name, address and date of birth and a summary of your health information including: Diagnosis and test results, any allergies you have, medications and treatment you receive.
